

women: working women inside and outside of the home, women of color, Native women, disabled women, immigrant women, Muslim women, lesbian, CIS, queer and trans women.

These efforts are part of a new international feminist movement that organizes resistance not just against Trump and his misogynist policies, but also against the conditions that produced Trump, namely the decades long economic inequality, criminalization and policing, racial and sexual violence, and imperial wars abroad.

Portland Oregon Women's Film Fest — Screening of "Harlan County U.S.A."



Portland JwJ is excited and proud to be a Co-Presenter of the POW Film Fest Saturday Night Screening of "Harlan County, U.S.A." **March 10th, 7pm at the The Hollywood Theatre!**

Academy Award–winning "Harlan County U.S.A." unflinchingly documents a grueling coal miners' strike in a small Kentucky town. With unprecedented access, Kopple and her crew captured the miners' sometimes violent struggles with strikebreakers, local police, and company thugs. The film is a heartbreaking record of the thirteen-month struggle between a community fighting to survive - in an area where many lived in shacks with no indoor plumbing and worked at jobs with little security and dangerous conditions - and a corporation dedicated to the bottom line.

The filmmaker, Barbara Kopple, long-time advocate of workers' rights, will be in attendance for a Q & A following the film. We hope to see you there!

The 2011 Wisconsin Uprising — Lessons for us today in the shadow of Janus and ongoing attacks on working people



[Portland Rising](#)--a committee of Jobs with Justice--invites you to a presentation and discussion on the 2011 Wisconsin Uprising and the lessons it can teach us today in the shadow of the Janus Supreme Court decision and the ongoing attacks on working people.

Wednesday March 14th, 7-9pm at the Portland Association of Teachers (345 NE 8th Ave)

The uprising began on Valentine's day 2011 in response to Governor Scott Walker's introduction of a bill designed to destroy public sector unions. Tens of thousands of union

and community members occupied the capitol and tens of thousands more engaged in a series of marches and demonstrations over a four-month period.

How did the movement grow so fast? What role did unions play? What were some of the strategic choices made by unions and working people in their struggle against the right in Wisconsin? Come hear uprising participants Nikki Mandell and Rick March as they reflect on these questions and share insights relevant to building resistance to the current attack on unions and working people. This event is free, open to the public, and is ADA accessible.
